The Young Writers Workshop at Southern Illinois University Carbondale is a two-day program designed to give high school freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and seniors the chance to explore and develop their talents in poetry and prose writing.

During the workshop, students will participate in sessions on subjects as varied as forms of poetry, small-press publishing, and narrative techniques. While on campus, SIU students, faculty, Young Writers Workshop participants and specially selected guest writers will perform readings from their own creative writing.

PROGRAM FACULTY

The program director is Allison Joseph, associate professor SIU's in an Department of English. She is the author of six books of poems, and she travels frequently across the country to read from her work. The assistant director is Kelson Hatfield, a poet and teacher who is a master of fine arts candidate in SIU. writing creative at Joseph Hatfield will be assisted by SIU and graduate students in creative writing and by SIU creative writing program alumni and guests.
