Title: Printmaking Imagery on Clay

This workshop will focus on using the printmaking techniques of monoprinting and screenprinting on clay to create a narrative onto the surface. We will look at examples of ceramic artists in the field who use these techniques to express a personal narrative using symbols and imagery to tell a story on the surface of their work. Attendees are encouraged to bring some black and white laserjet images, if they would like to try to print those as a monoprint transfers onto clay.

Title: Collaborative Mini-Mural Making

Let me share with you my experience creating collaborative murals. I have been creating murals with multi-grade levels for years. We have created murals have been permanent paintings on walls as well as installations that can be removed if necessary. In this workshop, I will share my mural lesson plans, some templates that I have used (feathers, Leaves, Puzzle Pieces,) and discuss my mural making process/techniques. Title: Personal Spaces: Rooms Made with Clay

In this workshop, students design and create a miniature ceramic room that represents a personal story, memory, or aspect of their identity. They will explore storytelling through form, texture, and surface decoration, using hand-building techniques such as slab construction, scoring and slipping, and underglaze painting. Emphasis will be placed on thoughtful design choices—furniture, objects, and architectural details—that symbolize their experiences and emotions. By the end of the project, students will have a unique, three-dimensional representation of their story, fostering both artistic expression and personal reflection.

Title: False Narratives as an Art Lesson
