Save the Date—LIR Is OnTheRoad

For all things French in the Heartland, make plans to join us **October 16** on the next *OnTheRoad* excursion! As we wend our way home along the Mississippi River, passing through the town of Prairie du Rocher (1722), we will follow the Kaskaskia Trace, the oldest road in Illinois, established by Native Mound Builders and conveniently adopted by the French.

Registration is open now and will close August 28. The nonrefundable cost is \$119.00, including brunch. Our bus will leave the Arena parking lot at 8:00 a.m., returning by 6:30.

9:30-11 Chevre at Baetje Farms, Bloomsdale, Missouri. Tour the creamery that produces award-winning artisan goat cheese, meet the goats, and taste their cheeses.

11:15-12 Quiche for Brunch at The Kozy in Bloomsdale. Also includes a charcuterie board, house salad, and coffee. Gluten-free option available.

1-3 Guided tour of the Old Cahokia Courthouse (1740/1793), the Holy Family Log Church (1799), and the Jarrot Mansion (1810) in Cahokia Heights (formerly Sauget), Illinois. Both the courthouse and the church were constructed in the French Colonial vertical timber, post-on-sill style. While the courthouse is largely a 1939 CCC reconstruction using some original materials—it was moved to the 1904 St. Louis World's Fair, to Chicago's Jackson Park in 1906, and finally back to its original location—the log church is fully original and the only French Colonial-style church in the U.S. or Canada still in regular use. The Jarrot Mansion, built in the American Federal style, is the oldest brick home in Illinois.

-4:45 Fort des Chartres (1718). Rebuilt four times in the 18th century, this is part of a chain of French forts that also included Fort Massac and Fort Kaskaskia.

5-5:15 Modoc Rock Shelter National Historic Site. This shelter bluff was occupied by indigenous peoples over a period of 9,000 years and excavated in 1951 by SIU anthropologist Irving Peitman.
