Using Sound to Study Wildlife Ecology



Brent has used citizen-science efforts to listen in on nature before, during, and after the recent solar eclipse. In addition to the Eclipse Soundscapes Project, he also runs the Sounds of Nature project, a citizen- science project aimed at understanding changes in biodiversity over time by studying landscapes.

Brent is very enthusiastic about his work and will offer new perspectives on nature to his audience. He is also a strong supporter of citizen-

science and is a great resource for those desiring opportunities to be part of science.

Dr. Pease is an assistant professor in the forestry program at Southern Illinois University. His research interests include wildlife ecology, participatory science, and university education in natural resources. A native of Southern Illinois, Brent returned to the region with his wife and two kids.
